

The Driver Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA) contract with the Post Office is due to expire in March 2024. This loss is one of many services over the last few years which have been removed by Government and may result in the closure of post offices across the UK. This begs the question as to whether the Government actually wants a Post Office network?

Post offices carry out over six million DVLA transactions every year, with more than half being paid for in cash, over the post office counter. However if the contract is lost the only option for buying DVLA services will be online. The digitally-excluded and vulnerable in society will be the most impacted by this loss of service.

The National Federation of SubPostmasters calls on Government to reverse its decision to remove DVLA services from the Post Office network.
